



### British Histories: A Look Back

Lord Kitchener: a racist but

glorified by the Brits during

the WW2





He oversaw the first ever concentrations camps during the Boer Wars. Over 100,000 black Africans were captured and tens of thousands died, **no records** were kept. Today, Kitchener's statue overlooks all of Chatham.

Step 1: Let's make two big circles, one inside of the other.


Step 2: Act out a communication scenario. You will have 1-2 minutes. The inside and the outside of the circle will have two different parts so listen close!
